## 22<sup>ND</sup> STREET PAVING PROJECT (Wednesday, 1/24/24 through Friday, 1/26/24)

## I. PARKING

- LINDA COURT 21<sup>st</sup> Street is your best parking area.
- SHORT GRETTA CUL-DE-SAC Your best parking choice would be Clubhouse.
- We suggest not parking on Tierra Buena to avoid large truck & equipment traffic.
- Residents facing 22<sup>nd</sup> Street may park on 21<sup>st</sup> street, Beck Lane, Betty Elyse or Gretta Place (see map on reverse side). Arrows on map indicate entry and exit routes using these streets.
- Overnight Parking will be allowed on above streets and at the Clubhouse.
- Do not block driveways.

## II. SUGGESTIONS


- Do not schedule deliveries on affected dates. Arrange pick-ups at facilities or distribution centers.
- Arrange & Notify homecare, shared ride services, etc. of street closures and alternate access (see map on reverse side).

We understand that this will be inconvenient for a few days and we appreciate your support and cooperation during this time. Please reach out to any Board Member if you have any questions or concerns.

## III. \$250 FINE POLICY

• 22<sup>nd</sup> Street between Waltann and Tierra Buena will be closed for repaving beginning January 24 through January 26. Any Northtown resident will be assessed a fine of **\$250 if they drive through or around the barricades** that are in place to block vehicular traffic. This policy will remain in effect throughout the duration of the project and will be lifted upon completion of the project and the barricades are removed by representative of the paving company.

## Northtown Organizations and Clubs:

Northtown has several organizations and clubs **open to all residents** that operate within the boundaries of Northtown but are not an official part of Northtown Homeowners' Association. They are as follows:

### KOFFEE KLATCH

Meetings are held Thursdays in the Northtown Clubhouse. Check the Newsletter calendar and Koffee Klatch article each month for dates and times. This group is open to **all women in the Northtown community**. We share our life experiences and are always looking for ways to improve ourselves and our neighborhood. We collect non-perishable food items for St. Vincent DePaul Society. During the holidays, we contribute to various charities. We host guest speakers, and frequently, Black Mountain Police Precinct officers visit to keep us informed on ways to keep our community safe. The first Thursday of each month, we celebrate Birthdays for that month. Meetings are Brown Bag (bring your own lunch). Dues are \$ 1.00 per meeting.

#### NORTHTOWN COMMUNITY BLOCKWATCH/Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol (PNP)

This group is registered with the Phoenix Neighborhood Services Department - ID# 1323. Block Watch/PNP members patrol Northtown to be the "eyes and ears" for the Black Mountain Police Precinct. This group started in 2001 and has continued patrolling, applying for grants to buy safety and security items such as motion detector lights, dusk to dawn lights, and more.
