



Greetings!

In the beginning of January, PNP had their first Quarterly meeting for 2023. Following that meeting and the recording of patrol hours for the last quarter of 2022, I am happy to announce that Northtown has reported a total of 4,144 hours patrolled for the year of 2023. Thank you to all, of your PNP Members. Those hours do not include the watchful eyes of other residents (not PNP members) who are alert to things going on in the community and act.

February is the month that we recognize the Fire Department Stations who serve our community. We hope that you will show the Fireman your love and support with some Cookies for the Firemen on February 8th. Koffee Klatch is coordinating this event again, please bring your homemade (or fancy purchased) cookies to the Clubhouse by 11:00 AM on Thursday, February 8th.

We all are aware that we do not allow soliciting in our community. However, this is an election year, and I have already experienced a representative of an "Election Group" stopping at my house. And this caused me to think, it is a good time to remind the Northtown residents of the Arizona Statute 33-1808 Section G, which reads:

Arizona Statutes 33-1808 - Section G:

G. Notwithstanding any provision in the community document, an association shall not prohibit door to door political activity, including solicitations of support or opposition regarding candidates or ballot issues, and shall not prohibit the circulation of political petitions, including candidate nomination petitions or petitions in support of or opposition to an initiative, referendum or recall or other political issue on property normally open to visitors within the association, except that an association may do the following:

- 1. Restrict or prohibit the door-to-door political activity from sunset to sunrise.
- 2. Require the prominent display or an identification tag for each person engaged in the activity, along with the prominent identification of the candidate or ballot issue that is the subject of the support or opposition.

So yes, they are allowed to walk through the community with identification displayed and ring your doorbell. If you feel ok to answer any questions, that is your choice. If you prefer not to, just let them know, but please be polite.

Hope all are enjoying or at least managing through this "colder" weather. Just keep in mind those 100-degree days will be here again, before you know it.

Cream Cheese Pie

(12 Tomatoes - internet)

FILLING

2 (8oz) packages cream cheese, softened.

2 eggs

1 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 prepared graham cracker crust

TOPPING

1 cup sour cream

2 tablespoons sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon vanilla

PREPARATON

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. For the filling, combine cream cheese, sugar, eggs, and vanilla in a large bowl. Beat until smooth.

Transfer filling mixture to the graham cracker crust and bake for 35 minutes.

While the filling bakes, start on the topping. In a medium sized mixing bowl, combine sour cream, sugar, and vanilla.

Remove pie from oven after 35 minutes and raise the temperature to 450 degrees F. Pour the topping mixture onto the pie and return to oven for 5 additional minutes. Allow pie to cool before serving.

Northtown Organizations and Clubs:

Northtown has several organizations and clubs **open to all residents** that operate within the boundaries of Northtown but are not an official part of Northtown Homeowners' Association. They are as follows:

KOFFEE KLATCH

Meetings are held Thursdays in the Northtown Clubhouse. Check the Newsletter calendar and Koffee Klatch article each month for dates and times. This group is open to **all women in the Northtown community**. We share our life experiences and are always looking for ways to improve ourselves and our neighborhood. We collect non-perishable food items for St. Vincent DePaul Society. During the holidays, we contribute to various charities. We host guest speakers, and frequently, Black Mountain Police Precinct officers visit to keep us informed on ways to keep our community safe. The first Thursday of each month, we celebrate Birthdays for that month. Meetings are Brown Bag (bring your own lunch). Dues are \$ 1.00 per meeting.

NORTHTOWN COMMUNITY BLOCKWATCH/Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol (PNP)

This group is registered with the Phoenix Neighborhood Services Department - ID# 1323. Block Watch/PNP members patrol Northtown to be the "eyes and ears" for the Black Mountain Police Precinct. This group started in 2001 and has continued patrolling, applying for grants to buy safety and security items such as motion detector lights, dusk to dawn lights, and more.
