**Greetings Good Neighbors!** 

Our wonderful Board members, Committee members and our Osselaer Property Manager are very busy keeping things running so smoothly it appears Northtown Homeowners Association, Incorporated runs itself. It does not!! I'm fortunate to be able to spend some time with them. They are amazing and all of us can be very thankful.

It is best when you have property concerns to contact Sharla Cook, our Property Manager. Please do not contact Board members. Call or email Sharla. Please include your name, lot number or address, phone number and exactly what your concern is. Sharla is a good problem solver. For privacy reasons, we cannot discuss individual issues – just that it is being addressed.

This past month I attended a Roads Committee meeting which was very productive. Thanks to Dave Ransom, we have stages of road repair in a spreadsheet so it can flex with changes. This will be key for our Reserve Study. I sent letters to Pinnacle Peak staff for their great work on our road replacement. A letter is being drafted to our City Council Representative, Debra Stark, to explore the possibility of the City of Phoenix maintaining the +/- 200 sf roadway used for commercial use (at the far east end of Waltann connecting to Cave Creek).

I went on a driving Inspection of our community with Sharla Cook and Dennis Franks. This is done to ensure each of us is keeping our property in a manner that is pleasant to ourselves and our neighbors and keeps our property values up. If a plant or tree dies or part of it dies, please be considerate of your neighbors and promptly remove the dead plant, tree or branches/segments. Also, Sharla will post examples of wildflowers versus weeds on the Northtown bulletin board. A yard full of weeds with one or two wildflowers does not qualify as exempted wildflowers.

Now that the weather is getting warmer some neighbors need to think about painting projects. There are quite a few shabby looking mailboxes/light poles. Ask yourself if there is rust on it, broken glass, faded house numbers. Remember we are a safer community when we look like we care about our homes. Coming home to a well-maintained house and yard boosts a person's mood.

Hopefully, I'll see you at the Spring Member's Meeting.

# Chocolate Chip Pan Chewies

(Internet - 12 Tomatoes)

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup unsalted butter, melted	Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease

# Northtown Organizations and Clubs:

Northtown has several organizations and clubs **open to all residents** that operate within the boundaries of Northtown but are not an official part of Northtown Homeowners' Association. They are as follows:

#### KOFFEE KLATCH

Meetings are held Thursdays in the Northtown Clubhouse. Check the Newsletter calendar and Koffee Klatch article each month for dates and times. This group is open to all women in the Northtown community. We share our life experiences and are always looking for ways to improve ourselves and our neighborhood. We collect non-perishable food items for St. Vincent DePaul Society. During the holidays, we contribute to various charities. We host guest speakers, and frequently, Black Mountain Police Precinct officers visit to keep us informed on ways to keep our community safe. This group started in 2001 and has continued patrolling, applying for grants to buy safety and security items such as motion detector lights, dusk to dawn lights, and more.
