Policy Governance is a form of governing/operating which emphasizes Board decisions being based on pre-determined written policies. February greetings from Roads and Grounds.

What happened to January? It went by so fast. Here's what we are doing in February.

Now is the time of year that our landscaping crew can do some work on the grounds away from our Clubhouse. If there is a tree in a common area that is presenting you with some sort of challenge, this is the time to let us know. Maybe the tree is too close to your fence or part of it is hanging too low over your yard. We will check it out and put it on the list of problems to address as time allows.

In addition, we are making plans for sealing and crack filling on 22nd Street and Waltann. The project will start at our Greenway entrance and go past the Clubhouse to the corner where Waltann turns east. This will require us to close the Greenway entrance to the corner of Waltann and Waltann. If you live on the affected part of Waltann, you will be affected for one day. On that day, you will be asked to park your car in the Pool parking lot. You will need to use the Tierra Buena entrance or the Waltann entrance to the community while this closure is in effect. We do not yet know which day, but it will probably be in March or April. We will provide more information to you as it becomes available.

"Swedish Salad"

Janie's Recipe (Submitted by Annabel Kipp)

1 can French Style Green Beans - drained

1 can White Shoe Peg Corn - drained

1 can Le Sueur Peas - drained

1 cup chopped celery

1 cup chopped purple or white onion 1 cup chopped green or red pepper

Dressing:

- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup vegetable oil
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup vinegar and

Optional: 1 tsp salt and pepper

Mix dressing and pour over vegetables. Make this a couple of days ahead. Will keep Refrigerated for a long time.

KOFFEE KLATCH
