My concern is that as our HOA was one of the earlier HOAs in Arizona, its founding documents were slanted to give more power to the homeowners and less to the governing board, whereas in recent decades, more often the greater powers have been given to HOA governing boards and less to homeowners.

For myself, I would like to fully understand what we are being asked to change.

I hope we get some good rain soon even though it will result in more of those pesky weeds that will need to be pulled. If you are interested in a weed control service, there is a company who advertises weed control services in the newsletter. They are the same folks that do the weed control in our common areas. I am told that they are willing to offer a discount for Northtowners who are willing to schedule with them while they are already in the neighborhood on one of their monthly visits.

We are still planning on crack filling and sealing 22nd Street and Waltann in the near future, but we do not yet have specific dates. Please stay tuned for more news about this project.

"Million Dollar Cake"

(Submitted by Jean Shelton)

1 Yellow cake from mix, baked in a 9x13" pan

2 cups milk, divided

1 (8 oz) pkg cream cheese, softened

1 (4 serving size) pkg instant vanilla pudding

1 (20 oz) can crushed pineapple, well drained

Cool Whip

Pecan pieces

Bake and cool cake.

Blend $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk & cream cheese (will be a little lumpy).

Prepare pudding mix with remainder of milk.

Add cream cheese mixture to pudding & blend well. Spread on cooled cake.

Top with well drained pineapple & carefully spread cool whip (6 oz or more, if desired) over pineapple layer.

Sprinkle nuts on top. Refrigerate until well set.

KOFFEE KLATCH

Meetings are held Thursdays in the Northtown Clubhouse. Check the Newsletter calendar and Koffee Klatch article each month for dates and times. This group is open to **all women in the Northtown community**. We share our life experiences and are always looking for ways to improve ourselves and our neighborhood. We collect non-perishable food items for St. Vincent DePaul Society. During the holidays, we contribute to various charities.
